



Svarta river is located in the northern highlands of Iceland one and a half hour drive from Akureyri.

It originates from lake Svartárvatn from which it flows through lava fields down Bárðardalur valley before joining the glacial river Skjalfandafljót.

This river is sometimes referred to by locals as the little Laxá in Mývatnssveit. Although quite smaller than the famous Laxá it has some resemblance with its great variety of pools and fishing situations that challenge even the most experienced angler.


This is catch and release river with average trout weighing from 1.6 - 2.0 kg. with several bigger once landed every year.

Dry fly fishing works really well here but nymphs and streamers are also effective.

The fishing cabin is basic, but well functional. There are three bedrooms, bathroom with shower and a common area. There we make our own food in a fully equipped kitchen.

This river is probably still one of Iceland's best kept trout fishing secrets.





Brunná in Öxarfjörður is located in the north east of Iceland, two hour drive from Svartá.

This beautiful river is about 10 km long and is fished with a maximum of three rods, giving it unique exclusiveness.

Brunná flows through wonderful surroundings offering areas of unique beauty and diversity.

It has great variety of beautiful crystal clear pools holding mainly good size arctic char but also some local trout and sea trout.

The lodge is very comfortable and has two bedrooms and a sleeping loft, bathroom with shower and a spacious common area. There we make our own food in a fully equipped kitchen.

One of the things that makes Brunná exciting is that most of the time the char is actually spotted in the water before the fly is presented.

This is for sure one of our favourites.
